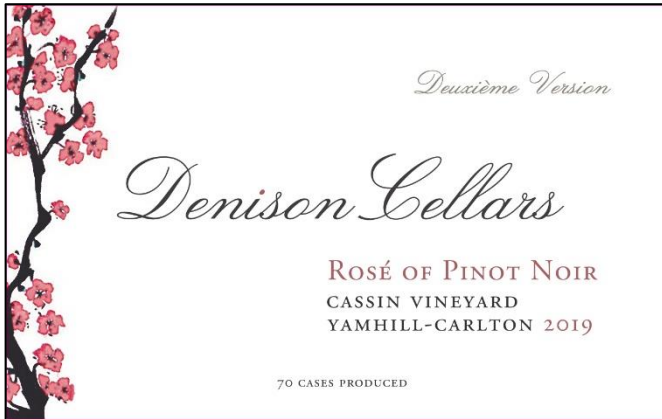


2019 DENISON CELLARS CASSIN VINEYARD ROSÉ OF PINOT NOIR

YAMHILL-CARLTON AVA, OREGON



THE VINTAGE

The 2019 growing season got off to a normal start with budbreak occurring in mid-April. The growing season was cooler than recent vintages with more overcast days and warmer more humid nights. Flowering completed very quickly in mid-June and there were very few days over 90 degrees for the remainder of the summer. September featured significantly more precipitation than usual, and as harvest began picking was scheduled around rain events. The quality of the harvested fruit was extremely high, and

the fruit for this wine was harvested on October 12th.

THE WINE

The 2019 Cassin Vineyard Rosé of Pinot Noir was produced from fruit harvested specifically for rosé, with a focus on ripe skins and flavors. The fruit was de-stemmed, cold-soaked for 4 days, then drained and pressed directly to a stainless steel tank for fermentation, which took 16 days to complete. The wine was aged in tank until it was bottled in May of 2020.

The fruit was sourced entirely from the Cassin Vineyard; clonal composition of the wine is 100% Wadenswil. This wine is deep pink in color, with flavors and aromas of raspberry, marionberry, and a hint of blueberry. The mouthfeel is rich, and bracing acidity creates a beautiful balance that flows into the long, seamless finish.

Enjoy this Rosé lightly chilled (48 to 52 degrees) with Spring and Summer fare. Only 70 cases were produced. To prevent any incidence of cork taint, this wine is bottled under a twist-off closure.
